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Abstract -

The goal of the study is to create a simple, economical, and powerful computer application enabling small construction companies to plan, design, and manage their projects. The creation of a package for the study and design of civil engineering structures is an important project that makes good use of the MS EXCEL environment. The primary goal of building a computerization system is to eliminate paper work and save time in management, hence increasing efficiency and reducing workload. It allows us the flexibility of creating required documents on screen as needed. Because a building comprises many structural parts such as beams, columns, and footings, each of which is designed according to Indian standards, we must individually estimate each element when evaluating materials and project costs, which is time demanding. There are different softwares available on the market for calculating the quantity of material necessary, but these softwares are expensive and require a higher level of competence to operate. One must have their own computer software, design aids, or spreadsheet to save time while estimating various structural elements. In this study, we created an excel programme spreadsheet for estimating quantity and material costs and designing various structural parts such as footings, beams, columns, and slabs, which allows us to make faster calculations during the design process.

Drawings aid in determining the structure's height, the depth to which hard strata are available, the thickness of walls and slabs, and so on.

Specifications- The description of the material to be used, its quality, and the precautions to be utilised for concreting can all be found in the specification. The specification aids us in getting a closer estimate to the actual cost.

Measuring Technique These are useful for determining quantities. These are units of measurement that are used to describe the amount of labour that goes into an object. These measuring modes are based on IS-1200.

Rates- It is vital to know material and labour rates in order to make an appropriate estimate. Rates for equipment, tools, and plant are also available. These prices are offered in DSR (District schedule rate) or CSR (Consolidated schedule rate) (Current Schedule Rate). The rates differ from one location to the next.

Formulas and Functions - A formula is an algebraic statement made up of values (numbers or cell references) and mathematical operators. On a worksheet, functions are used to simplify and shorten formulas, particularly those that conduct long or difficult calculations. Each range of cells in the function is referred to as an argument in Excel. It may be essential to use as many as 3 or 4 arguments for sophisticated calculations.

PROCEDURE

A sample of three sheets is offered in this paper to demonstrate the use of sheets in various elements of building work.

When a design sheet is employed, the first example shows how to use Excel to improve the design and analysis of a Column. The creation of Axially loaded short column subjected to axial load of 1500kN (FIG 1) is used to exemplify the concept and to show that using a design sheet reduces arithmetic errors and saves time when doing tedious calculations.

The approach for Column design can be broken down into the following steps: 1.) Given Pu, L, Cover, concrete grade, and steel grade 2.) Calculate the length of a short column. 3.) Determine the Slenderness Ratio. 4.) Calculating the amount of longitudinal reinforcement to be provided in Column. 5.) Using a suitable equation based on minimum eccentricity requirements, determine the area of steel for longitudinal reinforcement. 6.) Design of Helical Reinforcement and provision of a pitch check. 7.) Detailing.





The second example shows rate analysis for various construction components such as plastering, brickwork, excavation, and R.C.C. work. The Ratio of Plaster, the Thickness of Plaster, and the Area of Plastering are all required in the Procedure for Rate Analysis of Plastering Work. The following are the results of the Excel calculations: 1) Total Material Cost depending on Rate and Quantity 2) Wage cost calculated on a daily basis. 3) The total cost of the plastering job.

Similarly, for R.C.C work rate analysis, the amount of shuttering necessary is calculated.
